Introduction 2050 RTP

• Updated every four years (September 2019)

 Consider <u>all</u> travel modes: transit, freight, bike/ped, roadway, emerging technology, etc.

- Must have a 20+ year planning horizon
- Projects must be fiscally constrained
- Must meet air quality conformity requirements

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What is TDM?

2050 RTP

- Toolbox of strategies to reduce single occupancy vehicles (SOV) and improve capacity
- What works for you? <u>Not</u> one-size-fitsall (and not the government telling you what to do!)
- Support businesses and employees
- Voluntary efforts, though potentially mandatory in the future



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Who benefits from TDM?

2050 RTP

Employers / Business

- More appealing and marketing (climate, etc.)
- Expanded workforce and higher retention
- Cost effective (reduce need for parking, etc.)
- Tax benefits (transit and vanpool benefit)



Employees

- Choice and flexibility
- Reduced stress
- Potential tax benefits/cost savings



Communities

- More efficient land use
- Attractive to businesses and employees (quality of life)
- · Improved road safety




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So what?

- GHG legislation (Medora's presentation)






% Destination **%** Origin

30,000 people commute in to Greeley for work every day


34,500 people commute out of Greeley for work every day

Average commute time: 24 minutes




15-20% of trips within Greeley are less than 1 mile




Average Daily Traffic


Traffic volume is highest on Highway 34 Bypass, 10th St (Highway 34 Business), and Highway 85




Walking and biking is highest downtown, near UNC and along 23rd Avenue



- GET ridership up 67% since 2011
- "Ride free with a student ID" helped fuel growth
 - 51% of ridership are students (D6 and UNC)
- All routes grew ridership since 2011 - Route 3 the most (218%), Route 1 (142%), Route 2 (122%)

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
