

Greeley Citizen Transportation Advisory Board (CTAB) Meeting






- Formed in 1988 and expanded to current boundary in 2007


- The NFRMPO Models the Northern Subarea of the Denver/North Front Range 8-hour Ozone Nonattainment Area.

 Greeley.


NFRMPO Region Today

- 3 Million users on the Regional Non-Motorized Corridors











By 2045, the NFRMPO region is estimated to have...


- 883,000 residents (+82.8% over 2015)

NFRMPO Awards Over \$15M in Federal Funding in Transportation Projects in 2021 Call for Projects

In late 2021 the NFRMPO opened the 2021 Call for Projects to award \$15.8M federal funding in FY2023 2025. The funding programs in the call Included Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ), Surface Fransportation Block Grant (STBG), and Transportation Alternatives (TA). These programs fund a variety of transportation projects including improvements to roadway and Intersections



pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure, transit vehicle purchases, and projects which reduce congestion and improve air quality.

The Call for Projects was open from October 8 to December 10, 2021. Eight agencies submitted a total of 20 applications. A sooring committee comprised of project applicants and Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) members scored the CMAQ and STBQ project applications, and the NoCo Bike and Ped Collaborative scored the TA applications. All projects were scored based on criteria developed for each funding program to provide the greatest benefit to the transportation system in the region.

At their meeting on March 3, 2022 the NFRMPO Planning Council approved projects recommended for funding from the scoring committees and the TAC. Ten projects were fully funded, two projects were partially funded, and six, projects have been waitlisted. The map illustrates the project types and locations of fully and partially funded projects. - 1. Rail Traffic
- 2. Proposed Safety Additions





Rail Traffic on UPPR:

- 12 trains per 24hr*
 - 6 trains from 6am-6pm
 - 6 trains from 6pm-6am
 - Trains speeds 25-50 MPH

Proposed Safety Additions

- Place Standard End of Street Barricade at key locations
 - Add Sections of Chain-link fencing to discourage illegal crossing
- Add signage to direct non-motorized traffic to safe crossing point
- Proposed Safety additions will be completed
 - Summer 2022





- Train Horns intended for vehicles
- Crossing gate bells/lights intended for pedestrians & bicycles – remain post Quiet
 Zone
- Quiet Zone South of 16th Street in effect as of November 2021
- Quiet Zone North of 16th Street will not go into effect until construction of Quad Gates at 8th and 13th Streets = Anticipated Spring 2023
