Discussion Items:

- 1. Repairs (unexpected damages)
 - a. New and ongoing repairs
 - i. Go West: Centennial Village art fence damage a vehicle traveling at a rather high speed on A street (the south side of the Monfort House) drove up on the sidewalk and damaged 3 fence panels. No painted panels were hit. Stan will contract a fabricator to rebuild/repair the panels.
- 2. Acquisitions (Donations, Direct Purchase, deaccessions)
 - a. The Craig Montgomery art collection that has been donated to the City has all been collected and we are in the process of inventorying the pieces. Kim will take images to the GAC meeting
 - b. The Stampede awarded a 100th Anniversary Belt Buckle to our City manager who asked that we frame it and add it to the art collection. Does anyone oppose accepting this donation? No Opposition but would like to know who the artist is; move forward with further discussion with GAC.
 - c. Longview Park Art near Promontory Park. Clint, our Park Planner thinks the bronze piece from the Loveland show titled, 'She Moves the Stars' (image below) would be wonderful at this park next spring. This would be purchased and installed with funds generated from the construction of the park near the entrance to the park. Action: vote to recommend the purchase of this piece for \$25,000 plus shipping and installation for installation in Spring 2023. No recommendation currently. Committee would like to see this along with other options to jury. It might have too many small pieces ie: stars to place in a park.
 - d. Possible New Purchase for Downtown 'Mecanique Celeste' by Phillipe Pallafray (image below). This would be purchased with Art Acquisition funds and would help fulfill our promise to install outwork downtown on an empty Sculpture on Loan pedestal with permanent artwork. Action: vote to recommend this sculpture to the Art Commission as a new 2023 purchase for \$18,000 plus installation costs; not to exceed \$25,000. Yes, unanimous vote to recommend to GAC.
- 3. Maintenance & Installations (regular cleaning, sealing etc. to avoid major repairs)
- 4. Planning (Outreach, and Master Planning)
 - a. Uptown Trees
 - Request from the DDA to add art trees going North 10th to 4th Street Action: vote to add to the Master Plan as a future sculpture locations as new street renovations are done. Yes, add to Master Plan
 - ii. Kim will move forward with asking LINK library if we can collaborate to install one or two art trees on or near the new building as previously approved by the Art Commission.
 - b. Art request for NW corner of 4th St & 35th Ave Action: vote to recommend to the Art Commission as a new project
 - c. Traffic Cab update the committee met and recommend that we post a call for new designs this Fall/Winter. Then ask if CDOT will allow us to wrap traffic cabinets on 10th St. Action: vote to

recommend to the Art Commission 10th St as the 2023 location pending CDOT approval. Yes, recommend 10th St locations pending CDOT approval to GAC

- d. Coloring Book Update the committee met to begin discussing plans to change the artwork for 2023. It was agreed that to keep the continuity to the previous drawings, we should commission Ann Martinez as our graphic designer again this year if she is available.
- e. Kim will meet with D6 art teachers on September 26th to brainstorm ideas on how we can connect with Art in the future. This will also be a good time to ask for feedback on future coloring books.
- f. Review 5-year AMP w new projects inserted Action: vote to move forward
