Greeley Art Commission Minutes September 20, 2022

Robb Casseday called the meeting to order

A motion to approve the August minutes was made by Robb Casseday and seconded by Dik Munson. The motion passed unanimously.

Introductions were made for the interim Culture Manager Andrea Haring and visitor Pace Clinkey.

New Business and Action Items:

- 1. The Stampede has awarded a 100th Anniversary Belt Buckle to our City manager who asked that we frame it and add it to the art collection. Robb Casseday noted that the buckles are designed each year by local artists. Tony Milled moved to approve the vote to accept the Belt Buckle into the Permanent Art Collection. Robb seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.
- 2. New Purchase for Downtown The Ramp committee recommends purchasing 'Mecanique Celeste' by Phillipe Pallafray. If approved, this would be purchased with Art Acquisition funds in 2023 and would help fulfill our promise to install artwork downtown on previous Sculpture on Loan pedestal with permanent artwork. After discussion, Tom moved to approve the purchase of 'Mecanique Celeste' in 2023 purchase for \$18,000 plus installation costs; not to exceed \$25,000; Dik seconded the motion. The vote to approve the purchase was passed unanimously.
- 3. Art Master Plan
 - a. The committee reviewed an early draft of the 5-year AMP with new capital projects inserted. Tony moved to approve adding the projects; Eddie seconded the motion. It was unanimously approved.
 - d. The DDA has requested that the Art Commission add new Uptown Trees going North on 8th Ave between 10th & 4th Streets. The Ramp committee recommends adding these future sculpture locations to the Master Plan as new street renovations are done. Eddie moved to approve adding the sculpture locations to the 2023 Art Master Plan as recommended. Danyelle seconded the motion. It was unanimously approved.
- 9. Loveland Sculpture in the Park show Follow up; Robb and Eddie attended the show to look for sculptures that might be good for Greeley in 2023. Kim has gathered information for three sculptures as requested.
- 10. 12th St Outfall Art Adam Kuby has gone back to the drawing board and has submitted a preliminary new design. The 12th St Outfall committee thinks it has merit and have asked Adam to continue designing it.
- 11. New and ongoing repairs Go West: Centennial Village art fence damage a vehicle was traveling at a rather high speed on 'A' St just west of 14th Ave (south side of the Monfort House), drove up on the sidewalk and damaged 3 fence panels. No painted panels were hit. Stan will contract a fabricator to rebuild/repair the panels.
- 12. Paint the Town Traffic Cab update The PTT committee met and recommends that we post a call to artists for new designs this Fall/Winter. Then ask if CDOT will allow us to wrap traffic cabinets on 10th St.

- in Spring of 2023. If not approved by CDOT, alternate locations will be selected. Danyelle moved to approve the recommended 2023 10th St traffic cab locations, pending CDOT approval; Tom seconded the motion. It was unanimously approved.
- 13. Uptown Trees Kim will move forward with asking LINK library if we can collaborate to install one or two art trees on or near the new building as previously approved by the Art Commission.

14. Project Reports:

- a. The Craig Montgomery art collection that has been donated to the City has all been collected and we are in the process of inventorying the pieces.
- b. Coloring Book Update the committee met to begin discussing plans to change the artwork for 2023. It was agreed that to keep the continuity in the drawings in previous books, we will commission Ann Martinez as our graphic designer again this year if she is available.
- c. Broadview/#3 Ditch trail stamps Installation is being pushed out to the fall 2022.
- d. Fire Station #6 –Looking at an early October installation.
- e. Greeley Funplex Mural in progress Julia Williams has begun painting her mural; you can see the progression by entering the front doors of the Family Funplex and going straight forward to the waiting area. Julia is will mostly be painting on weekdays for the next couple weeks.
- f. New Rodarte Bus Wrap on hold until 2023
- g. Excel Energy Utility Cabinets No change from last report.
