Greg McIntosh was introduced as a newly appointed member of the Board.

- 2. APPROVAL OF AGENDA A motion was made by Monica Ramirez to approve the agenda. The motion was seconded by Sharon Wright and passed unanimously.

# PARKS & RECREATION ADVISORY BOARD STAFF REPORTS – May 5, 2023

# John Dargle - Director of Culture, Parks, and Recreation

### Eric Bloomer – Parks Superintendent

Parks:

- Parks staff are working to have all restrooms up and running by Monday May 1<sup>st</sup> and have also been turning on irrigation since mid-April.
- Soccer at Monfort ends after the first week in May and staff have a full plan of field rehabilitation task scheduled to repair damage from last fall and this spring.
- The re-seeding project for the North end of Bittersweet will start the second week in May. A fescue blend will be seeded in that will be mowed more frequently to look a bit more like bluegrass, but will still provide some water savings.
- Planting at Centennial Park has started. The project should start to wrap up in late May and the playground should start installation in May or June.
- Seasonal staff positions have not been able to be filled due to a small pool and unqualified candidates. A plan is in place to use some seasonal staff dollars to contract out the weekend restroom cleaning duties for the season to a cleaning company. This will allow staff to focus on Mon-Fri maintenance without having to work 7 days a week.

#### Forestry:

- Annual Arbor Day Celebration was held Saturday April 29<sup>th</sup> at Glenmere Park at 9am.
- Staff are busy turning on irrigation systems and making repairs from plow and snow damage.
- Tree plantings are underway throughout the Parks and ROW.

## Linn Grove Cemetery:

- The contractor installing the new irrigation system has been surveying and laying out the new system and construction should start the first week of May.
- Staff have finished the plan for the Memorial Day Celebration. The event will be Monday, May 29<sup>th</sup> at Linn Grove starting at 9am.

#### Staffing

- Interviewing for final fulltime Tech I position.
- Seeking part-time and seasonal groundskeeper staff for the vegetation management season.
- Ellen Bergley has been hired as the Volunteers for Outdoor Colorado Weld County Volunteer Partnership Coordinator. This position is housed at the NAT office through a partnership between NAT and VOC.

#### **Capital Projects**

- Greeley #3 Canal Trail The project is nearly complete. Anticipate a final inspection by end of April.
- Poudre River Trail Duran Section | An agreement with the landowner on area being sold to NAT has been reached. Still waiting for the execution of the LWCF grant.

• Poudre River Trail – Poudre Ponds | A 30% design has been submitted by the consultant and reviewed by the City. Likely project construction in late summer/early fall of 2023.

#### Maintenance/Restoration/Equipment

- Moved legacy PRT kiosk from Island Grove to Rover Run Dog Park.
- NAT crew hosted Native and Naturalized Landscape Maintenance workshop for 30 participants from City and UNC to further best practices of maintenance and management of native landscapes.
- First mow of the Poudre River trail at the end of April.

#### Strategic Planning/Policy

- **Trail Master Plan** | The project team has developed a GIS story map that will serve as the primary tool for public engagement and will be the bulk of the final plan when completed. A technical advisory team and public engagement opportunities will ramp up by the summer.
- Shurview Master Plan | A second round of concepts have been received and staff is refining. Two focused engagement meetings were held in April with important stakeholders representing a holistic cross-section of the community. The IGA with Weld County is being routed for signatures, which will allow for an early summer opening of the property.

#### Volunteer/Outreach

- Presented to District 6 middle school and high teachers and UNC Earth Guardian youth conference about Shurview project; received input from 65 people on what they would like to see at Shurview.
- Continued engagement with east Greeley community via events with High Plains Library District.
- Presented to Weld Senior Network about general NAT projects.
- NAT social media statistics for March:

  - o 948 engagements (i.e., likes, comments, shares, etc.)

#### **Restoration/ Land Management**

- Began chemical application for kochia and other early-season species.
- Implementing native seeding projects at Pebble Brook NA and Rover Run Dog Park.
