# GREELEY PARKS AND RECREATION ADVISORY BOARD MEETING MINUTES – May 5, 2023

# 1. ROLL CALL

The Greeley Parks and Recreation Advisory Board met Friday, May 5, 2023, at 7:00am at the Rodarte Center. Board members joining: Vicente Vega-Ruiz, Monica Ramirez, Sharon Wright, Louise Wilson, Shane Kigin, Adam Michaels and Greg McIntosh. Staff joining: John Dargle (Director of Culture, Parks, and Recreation), Eric Bloomer (Parks Superintendent), Kristen Wilkinson (Community Conservation Fellow), Zach Bray (Budget Analyst) and Nancy Milton (Office Manager).

Adam Michaels was introduced as a newly appointed member of the Board.

- **2. APPROVAL OF AGENDA** Agenda approved as submitted.
- **3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES** A motion was made by Monica Ramirez to approve the minutes of the previous meeting. The motion was seconded by Sharon Wright and passed 7-0.

#### 4. PUBLIC INPUT

5. BOARD MEMBER COMMITTEE REPORTS – Art Commission – Sharon Wright: Public Art coloring books have been distributed to all 3<sup>rd</sup> graders in the school district. Improvements this year include a color cover and translation to Spanish as well. The artwork along the bottom of the pool at Discovery Bay is deteriorating and will be replaced following the summer season. Artwork for Long View Park has been selected. Clint Anders, Park Planner, presented information on the Delta Park Project.

### 6. STAFF REPORTS

#### John Dargle

- The firm BerryDunn has been selected as the consultant on the CPRD Comprehensive Master Plan. This Board will be involved in this process over the next 12-18 months.
- John recognized Shiloh Hatcher, City Forestry Manager, who has received the Colorado Tree Coalition's Lifetime Achievement Award. Eric Bloomer nominated Shiloh based on his work over the last 27 years with the City of Greeley.
- Daniel Lawrence has been hired as the new Recreation Division Manager to begin on May 25.
- A talent acquisition firm has been hired to assist in recruiting for the Cultural Affairs Manager position.
- The Deputy Director for CPRD and Business Manager positions have been posted and applications are being accepted.
- Zach Bray was introduced as the Budget Analyst who is working with CPRD to prepare the 2024 budget. Zach reviewed work that has already been completed along with next steps in the process.
- Staff are negotiating on a public/private partnership with Colorado Grit, a Tier 2 hockey team, for use of the Ice Haus.

- Board members received an email from the City Clerk's Office requesting Board input on the Triennial Review of the Board. Additional information packets were distributed to Members and will be emailed as well. Board members were requested to provide their input via email to Nancy Milton within the next couple of weeks. Compiling the input received, a draft will be prepared for review at the June meeting and submitted to the Clerk's Office by June 30.
- Staff are working with the Greeley Police Department to develop a general safety and security plan for our natural areas, parks and facilities. A 150-day plan has been laid out to gather information and prepare a recommendation to City Council.

# Eric Bloomer

- The Arbor Day celebration last Saturday at Glenmere Park had about 40 attending and five trees were planted with the help of volunteers.
- Last Sunday there was a "Meet Me In The Park" event at Delta Park to go over the final site plans for the project. The event was well attended by neighborhood residents.
- Staff are very busy with spring sports ending and preparing fields for summer programs. Due to the lack of applications for seasonal labor, a contractor has been hired to provide restroom/shelter cleaning on the weekends throughout the summer months. Some seasonal staff funding has been transferred to allow for hiring full time positions.

#### Kristen Wilkinson

- Interviews are being held for a full time Technician I position and applications are currently being accepted for seasonal staff for NAT. Also, the Volunteer Coordinator position has been filled and began in April. This is a partnership position between the City of Greeley and Volunteers for Outdoor Colorado.
- The #3 Canal trail is nearing completion.
- The Trails Master Plan is underway with public information and a survey available on the Speak-Up Greeley page.
- The Shurview Master Plan is moving forward with a meeting to be held in the coming weeks with the Technical Advisory Committee.
- An IGA between the City and Weld County for operation and management of the Missile Site park, has been routed for signatures.
- On May 13, there will a community event at Campo Esperanza Natural Area. The new sign will be unveiled and there will be restoration plantings and educational stations.

# **Eric Bloomer – Parks Superintendent**

#### Parks:

- Staff are prepping Bittersweet for seeding the north end. Work to repair spring soccer damage at Monfort has begun as well.
- Parks is currently fully staffed on paper, however, due to some medical absences we are short two
  FTE, one on Park Maintenance and one on ROW Maintenance. That does have an impact on some
  maintenance activities, primarily on medians and at Promontory.
- Work on Centennial Park is getting closer to completion. The landscape is about 75% installed, and the playground equipment should show up in June.
- Surveys are open for the replacements of the playgrounds at JB Jones, Sanborn, and Farr Parks.
- An ARPA application was submitted to convert the lighting at the Youth Sports Complex to LED.

#### Forestry:

- Staff are working to get grant applications completed for the Urban Forest Strategic Plan.
- Spring plantings continue, we have had over 100 trees planted so far and should be near 150 trees by the end of May.
- Staff are working on a plan to try to obtain some additional money for Horticulture maintenance for this year, focusing on Downtown and the city facilities.

#### **Linn Grove Cemetery:**

- Staff are prepping for the annual Memorial Day event.
- An ARPA application was submitted to remodel and expand the current office space and to add an outdoor amphitheater for services and special events.

- Seeking part-time and seasonal groundskeeper staff for the vegetation management season.

# **Capital Projects**

- Greeley #3 Canal Trail | The project has been completed, except for the HAWK signal across 4<sup>th</sup> St.
- Poudre River Trail Duran Section | An agreement with the landowner on area being sold to NAT has been reached. Still waiting for the execution of the LWCF grant.
- Poudre River Trail Poudre Ponds | A 30% design has been submitted by the consultant and reviewed by the City. Likely project construction in late summer/early fall of 2023.
- Site Signage | Site ID signage is in the process of being installed at Campo Esperanza NA, and Island Grove trailhead. Signage installations of three Site ID signs, along with an interpretive kiosk, will be completed by the end of May.

# Maintenance/Restoration/Equipment

- Constructed new soft surface trail/pads at Poudre Ponds and Rover Run dog park.
- Survey respondents showing strong support for the recent NAT 101 workshop held in April, with 100% saying they learned new information, and 87% saying they will use this new information in their professional roles.

• Post-storm and flooding cleanup, primarily on the Sheep Draw Trail corridor, in addition to a few Poudre Trail sections.

# **Strategic Planning/Policy**

- Trail Master Plan | The public engagement phase of the planning effort continues, with a recent opinion poll reaching 143 respondents. The Speak Up Greeley page continues to solicit feedback for proposed trail sections, and a technical advisory team and public engagement opportunities will ramp up by the summer.
- Shurview Master Plan | The project team continues to refine concepts for the property along with
  continuing to gather public feedback. The IGA with Weld County is waiting for County signatures, which will
  allow for an early summer opening of the property. Another Technical Advisory meeting was held in midMay which will further refine concepts. Finally, staff toured 60 people around the Shurview site, from
  Greeley Central HS, the Rodarte Center, and Aims Community College in May.

# Volunteer/Outreach

- Held Campo Esperanza NA community event, where approx. 60 residents were engaged. Parks and NAT
  received Starburst Award for excellent use of CO lottery funds. The new site ID sign for the property was
  also unveiled.
- Summer Teen Employment Program employee will start on May 22 and work for 10 weeks with NAT crew.
- Social media statistics for April:

  - o 1,443 engagements (I.e., likes, comments, shares, etc.)
